We'll make sure following move-in that you are directed to where to park for Orientation and then to our official Orientation Check-In location.

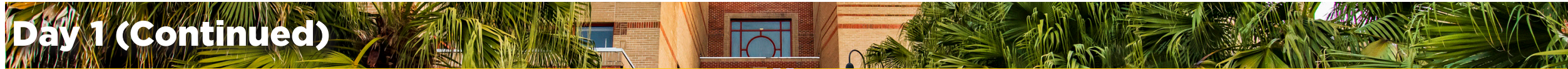

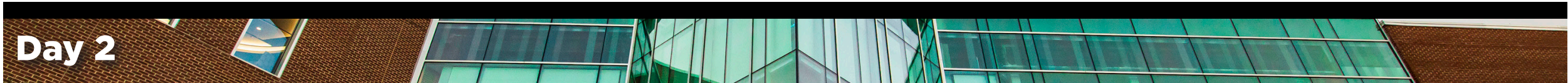
