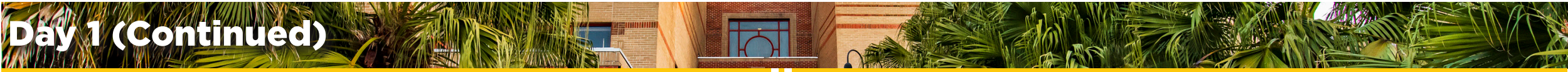

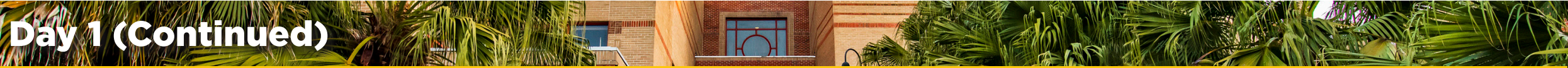

During this Knight Talk, we will dive into how to live these values on a daily basis and always make the KNIGHT choice. 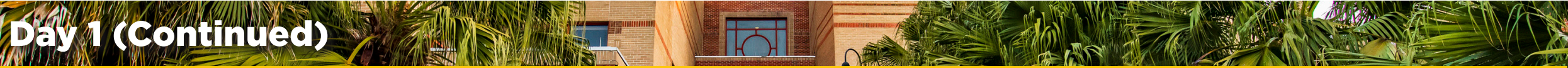
